Welcome to the first newsletter from the Mayor, Council and staff.

It is with much excitement and joy that we launch this first issue of our newsletter. We hope that you will read it and become better informed about all the positive things that are happening in our Town and become more engaged to make our Town a better place to live.

If you have not had the opportunity to come by the Town Hall to see the beautiful design renderings of our new complex at 629 Main Street. We also encourage you to stop in and share your ideals and plans on how to make Eastover a better place to live. We have completed the first phase of the building and hope to get started on the

second phase which is removing the remaining asbestos, and then putting on the roof. If you have questions about what's happening in the Town, please come to the Council meetings which are held the first Monday night of each month at 6:30pm or come by the Town Hall and read the minutes.

We have received over one million dollars in grants that involved road pavements, new water lines in Sunny Acres and the demolition of the old Eastover Elementary School. Again this year, we were able to serve residents who were 62 years and older with Thanksgiving/Christmas boxes. The Christmas activities were enjoyed by all who attended.

We also encourage you to use our state of the art library and participate in the many wonderful activities they provide monthly for persons of all ages.

Our Town Clerk Amie Jowers has been doing an excellent job of keeping accurate records of managing our finances. For the first time in the Town's history, we have received an unqualified audit which means all our funds are being accounted for properly. The Town of Eastover has also entered into an agreement with the Municipal Association of South Carolina Setoff Debt program, which allows the South Carolina Department of

Revenue (SCDR) to collect delinquent debts owed to public entities. The SCDR deducts the amount of the debt from the debtor's state income tax refund. The Town of Eastover has also entered into a consignment bus pass agreement with the The COMET. You can now purchase your bus ticket(s) from the Town. Isn't that awesome!

Joan Richardson does an exceptional job greeting those entering the building. Joan works in the Water department primarily making sure that records are kept on all new customers and those customers who request follow-up service. Water customers can pay
