I am excited about the town's future. Let us all remember that it takes all of us "working together to build a better Eastover community". The Eastover Council and I are here to serve you. Therefore, if you see something or hear something that can make a difference, please, let us know.

I know there are still some concerns about the water bill. Just a reminder, we operate our own water system and we would like to continue to give you the best timely service possible while meeting the demands of this great town. Unfortunately, sometimes this requires hiring outside companies to assist with repairing our leaks. We understand the yearly increase cost to the water bill may be challenging for some, but understand, it is necessary to keep up with the demanding cost of repairs and maintenance. Feel free to contact the Town Hall or come out to our monthly meetings to hear more about the water system and our financial obligations for the system. Don't rely on others for information but come get it firsthand.

Let me thank the residents who are making a difference by beautifying their homes and yards. All of us can take part in beautifying our Town by making sure our grass is cut and all of the debris is removed. Trash pickup is every Wednesday by Johnson Garbage service unless there is a holiday and then trash is picked up the following work day. We ask that you make sure your trash receptacle is stored behind your house or business until trash pick-up day.

Now for the exciting news regarding the Town:

- 1. We recently received a grant for our town! Many thanks go out to Senator Jackson, Representative Wendy Brawley and Jimmy Bale and the Department of Commerce for a donation of \$ 175,000 to assist the Town with the Economic Development Project over at the J. A Byrd Historical Building on Main Street.
- 2. We are excited about the new changes with The Comet bus system. We now have Comet bus tickets for sale at the Town Hall! The buses run every two hours starting at 6:23am until 6:23pm (Monday- Friday), 10:23am until 2:23pm (Saturday) from Chalk at Main Street bus stop shelter. The bus is also routed through Lewis Scott Court. High School students enrolled in a Richland One high school or program can ride the bus for free with a valid school ID. Town Hall. This is great news for our Town. Let's take advantage of this great service. We don't want to lose it for a lack of not using it.

- 3. We have been approved to receive a new sidewalk with an estimated cost of \$270,000.00! On Tuesday August 27th the Legislative Delegation Joint and Technical Committee met and approved a sidewalk installation along Old Eastover Road from Newtown to the Eau Claire Health Center. The urgency of this sidewalk has been presented and we will update you as to when the construction will begin. We are also considering additional lighting along that area, a cross walk with flashing lights and a reduced speed limit sign.
- 4. Richland County Council has agreed to cut the large ditches in the Town until we can obtain funding to pipe the ditches. They have already started this process. We will keep you abreast of the progress on this project.

Our next Council meeting is scheduled for September 9th @ 6:30pm. We have invited Mr. Paul Brawley; Richland County Auditor to address the impact of reassessment of the property will have on the Town's income. If you are unable to come to the Town's monthly meeting, call the office or come by between the hours of 8:30am to 5:00pm. Thank you for all that you do to make Eastover a better place to live. Love all of you and God's blessing upon each of you. If I can assist you in anyway please call or come by the office.

Richland County Sheriff Department's Safety Tips

- Report all suspicious activity, persons and cars to the police immediately. Nothing is too small to be reported.
- Do not open your door to anyone you do not know.
- Put your address (numerical #s) on your mailbox or at

the street for emergency personnel.

- Do not leave valuable items in plain view of windows (either in your home or cars).
- Do not "Flash" cash, credit cards or your wallet contents when making purchases. Know what you are going to pay before you go to the counter.
- · Leave a radio or TV on when you leave the house.
- Put lights on alternating timers when you leave home and do not disconnect them when you are home.
- Cut all bushes and trees back from around windows and doors to avoid hiding spots and shadows.
- Outside floodlights should be left on from dusk to dawn. REMOVE motion detectors and put in timers.
- If you arrive home and find an open window or door, or see a suspicious person or vehicle, call 911 from a neighbor's phone. Don't go inside!
- Do not give personal information out over the phone. Be aware of scams.
- Do <u>not s</u>top Delivery of your mail and newspaper when you travel.
- Always park in well-lighted locations and go shopping with a friend.
- <u>Be alert at all times</u>!! Be aware of who is watching you.
- Get to know your neighbors. Get involved in a neighborhood watch.
